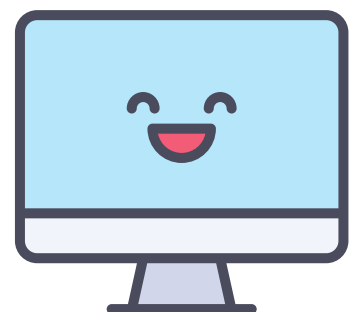


BOOKMOBILE

KINDER AND FIRST

Kindergarten will be learning about animal habitats in March and enjoying seasonal books about spring in April. They will continue to work on their early design skills in Technology. As their skill grows, they will create their first Google Slides presentations.

First-grade students will be learning about different animal traits with the wonderful "What If...?" series. They are also building their keyboarding skills throughout March and will be creating with Google Sheets in April.

SECOND AND THIRD

History is the focus of Library classes for these grades in March. Second-grade students will be learning about famous people from history with the series, "Ordinary People Change the World." Third-grade students will continue to journey with Lewis and Clark. In April, second graders will switch to learning about different professions as they imagine redesigning the school as a zoo. Third graders will journey west with different groups of people as they forge a path from Lewis and Clark to Westward Expansion.

In Technology, students in these grades will be practicing research, design, and digital citizenship skills.

FOURTH

In March, students will be completing mini-research activities based on the "I Survived" series. In April, they will begin investigating life in Montana during the pre-reservation era through the lens of the Apsaalooke (Crow) tribe.

Digital citizenship will be the main focus in Technology during March with review of typing, coding, and spreadsheets in April.

FIFTH

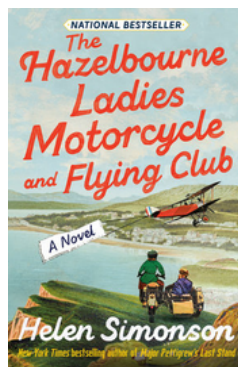
Fifth-grade students will plan a camping trip in March and then begin an inquiry unit focused on the Titanic in March. This gamified learning experience includes reading nonfiction passages, answering questions, gathering clues, using deductive reasoning, and solving a mystery.

In Technology, students will review and increase their digital citizenship skills. They will then work on various design and coding challenges to continue to build their skills.

SIXTH

In Library and Technology, students have begun traveling the world, one continent at a time. They will be researching a country, creating a video on Canva, designing and inputting information onto a website, and tracking real-world expenses using Google Sheets. This multicurricular unit uses skills that students have been building throughout their years of Tech.
